HI COTTAGERS !

My last contact with you was last July at our annual cottagers meeting at St. Ola ~~on~~ July 13, 1974 at 7:30 p.m. ~~for~~ ^{with} our annual meeting. I hope you will be there and be sure to bring any questions you may wish to ask your executive.

Again, this year we are expecting to have another visitation program. Last year's visitation was a great success, thanks to our canvassers hard work, along with Anita Waddells organizing. Your executive is most appreciative of the canvassers' time and effort. This year we would like you all to mail in your 1974 membership fee (\$2.00) so that the visiting committee will not be left in the embarrassing position of asking you for your fee. Last year over 87% of the cottagers paid their dues and this is by far the best results to date. Those, who have not paid last years fees know who they are and it is expected you will forward both 1973 and 1974 membership fees soon.

This year, if you are asked to help out on our visitation program, please be co-operative and do so.

Late in the fall, I wrote to both Mr. Ross Sprackett, Reeve of Tudor & Cashel Townships and Mr. Frank Robbins, Reeve of Limerick Township and asked some of the following questions which some of you cottagers were concerned with:

FIRSTLY - ROSS SPRACKETT - TUDOR - CASHEL

Question : Is there a possibility of enlarging parking area at the beginning of the East Road for the cottagers in the winter time?

Answer: We won't have time this fall (73) but are hopeful that next summer (74) something will be done on this matter along with Limerick Township.

Question: What about a parking area near Maple Landing, for cottage snow-mobilers?

Answer: Tudor Cashel are not prepared to do so at this time as maintenance is too costly. There is talk of township amalgamations, and if so, this would be the time to consider your request.

Question : Is there a possibility of the East Road garbage dump becoming a "community" undertaking between Limerick & Tudlor Townships?

Answer: The garbage dump on the East Road is available to all persons of Steenburg Lake - East Road cottagers. This matter was settled with Limerick Township last fall.

Question : Numerous people have inquired about the construction of 6 cottages on the 19th concession by one of our members. Could you advise?

Answer: Building permits were issued by the Tudor building inspector, for as yet there is no land use bylaw to prevent such things. The county health unit will most likely issue septic tank permits. These cottages are being built to rent, so is a commercial undertaking.

SECONDLY - FRANK ROBBINS - LIMERICK TOWNSHIP

Mr. Robbins confirmed a mutual agreement with Tudor - Cashel on the garbage dump issue on the East Road.

Mr. Robbins also confirmed that car park area at East Road entrance will be enlarged in 1974.


In reply to your executive request for "slow" signs for the West Road, Mr. Robbins informed me that council has agreed to erecting a sign between the end of the lake and Mc Geachie's cottage for traffic going west, and also a sign between Lloyd's Road and the cement bridge for the traffic going west.

Limerick Township has arranged for the cutting of weeds along the west road.

Did you remember that your executive purchased an electric pencil engraver for your use as an aid to help enforce conviction in the theft of stolen property? This was bought last summer for the purpose of marking your articles with your social security number so that in the case of theft, you may identify the articles, when recovered and enable the police to prosecute and return said articles. The pencil will be kept at my cottage for the month of July, and at Anita Waddells' cottage during the month of August, so kindly take advantage of its availability to you.

Your executive again joined the Federation of Ontario Cottagers Associations for 1974 and the annual meeting of F.O.C.A. is being held at the Lord Simcoe Hotel, King and University Ave. in Toronto on March 28, 1974 at 8:00 p.m. All you cottage owners are invited. Your executive will be represented at this meeting and I hope to see some of you there as well.
